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
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
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ARTISTIC DIRECTOR'S BIOGRAPHY



ROBERT MILLS

Since being named Artistic Director of Oklahoma City Ballet in 2008, Robert Mills has established himself as a prominent member of the Oklahoma arts scene and in the process has brought the company national recognition as one of the fastest growing ballet companies in the United States.

Born in Gary, Indiana and raised just outside of Chicago, Robert had access to world class ballet training at an early age. In Indiana he trained with Natalie Mayoch-Kolosci before moving on to study with some of Kolosci's mentors in Chicago including Richard Ellis, Christine DuBoulay, Larry Long, and Anna Paskevska. He completed his training at the School of the

Philadelphia Ballet, and at the Joffrey Ballet School in New York City. He then enjoyed a 14-year professional performing career dancing with numerous companies across the United States including Oklahoma City Ballet, Kansas City Ballet, Milwaukee Ballet, Philadelphia Ballet, among others.

Throughout Mills' tenure with Oklahoma City Ballet, patrons have enjoyed seeing the extraordinary advancements made in the scope and quality of the company's work on stage. Keeping a focus on education and community engagement, the organization can boast dramatically increased enrollment in its Yvonne Chouteau School under Mills' guidance plus the addition of numerous community engagement programs geared towards broadening OKC Ballet's reach in the community.

A prolific choreographer, Robert has created 12 new works during his time at Oklahoma City Ballet. His work has been seen across the United States, and in 2017 he was selected to take part in the National Choreographers Initiative in Southern California, an honor bestowed to only four American choreographers per year.

Reporting on Robert's time with OKC Ballet, *The Oklahoman* newspaper wrote; "During Mills' ten years of artistic leadership of OKC Ballet, dance lovers in Oklahoma have had the pleasure of seeing an all-but-failed ballet company grow into a vibrant, passionate, powerful group of performers." In 2018, Robert was presented with a Governor's Arts Award from the state of Oklahoma for community service.

Prior to joining Oklahoma City Ballet as Artistic Director, Robert spent three years as Artistic Director of Ballet Nouveau Colorado in Denver. Of his time in Colorado, *The Denver Post* wrote, "Mills was instrumental in putting it on the map...Mills is now an artistic director responsible for one of Colorado's biggest dance success stories." Ballet Nouveau Colorado has since divided into two organizations. The performing company is now known as Wonderbound and the school became Colorado Conservatory of Dance.

Mr. Mills is also a sought-after dance educator, drawing from over 25 years of teaching experience. He teaches classical ballet in the Yvonne Chouteau School and oversees the School Director and faculty. He has taught at numerous companies, schools and summer programs across the world.

Composer/Violinist Matthew Pierce is celebrated for his new classical scores commissioned by major American ballet companies. He has written for Joffrey Ballet, American Ballet Theatre, BalletMet, Cincinnati Ballet, Colorado Ballet, Kansas City Ballet, New York City Ballet, Houston Ballet, San Francisco Ballet, and the Washington Ballet. Night, an orchestral score set to a Chagall-inspired dreamscape ballet, has been seen at the Opera Garnier in Paris, Covent Garden in London, and City Center in New York. ALICE (in wonderland), with choreography by Septime Webre, has been produced

by 12 companies across the United States and the world travelling to Hong Kong and Taipei, Taiwan, and Perth, Australia in 2019.

The Washington Post called his score for ALICE, "The cherry on top: Pierce's visionary result, a shimmering landscape that weaves together bits of our own world — Asian, Middle Eastern, pop riffs, jazz — with a contemporary edge and a spirit of discovery. And, yes, wonder."

LIZ VANDAL Costume Designer

Liz Vandal began her illustrious career in 1988 as a self-taught fashion designer, bringing her creativity and originality to dance, circus, film, and mega-events. She soon began collaborating with renowned choreographers and dance companies around the world, working with the likes of Marie Chouinard, Kevin O'Day, Margie Gillis, Paris Opera, and the Hong Kong Ballet.

As a specialist in costume design for extreme movements, Vandal also designed flamboyant and masterful costumes for Cirque du Soleil's productions of OVO, Viaggio,

Sonor, Cosmos, and Excentick.

Vandal explores multiple domains in show business, from producing costumes for The Backstreet Boys' *Black 'n Blue Tour*, to working with multi-national IGT in creating Avatar costumes which were approved by Jon Landau and 20th Century Fox. After collaborating in many dance films and productions, Liz designed clothing for the feature film *The Lathe of Heaven* (Philip Haas) and Quebec's *La Turbulence des Fluides* (Manon Briand).

As a design and innovation consultant, Liz offers services to French multinational company Oxylane (Decathlon) in the development of new and avant-garde sportswear. One of her greatest career achievements was the creation of 3,000 costumes for the closing ceremony of the Baku 2015 European Games in Azerbaijan.

Vandal's on-going 20 year long collaboration with Artistic Director Septime Webre continues to unfold with the new productions of *The Wizard of Oz* (Kansas City Ballet), *Peter Pan*, and *ALICE (in wonderland)* (Hong Kong Ballet). Vandal won the Award of Best Costume Design at the Hong Kong Dance Awards, and was also nominated at Les Benois de la Danse.

SEPTIME WEBRE Choreographer

Septime Webre is an internationally recognised ballet director, choreographer, educator, and advocate. He joined Hong Kong Ballet as its Artistic Director in July 2017 after 17 years as Artistic Director of The Washington Ballet in Washington D.C., from 1999-2016. Previously he served as Artistic Director of the American Repertory Ballet, based in Princeton, New Jersey, from 1993-1999. In addition, Webre has served as the Artistic Director of Halcyon, a Washington DC-based foundation, launching an annual international Festival for Creativity in Washington D.C. in June 2018.

During Webre's tenure at The Washington Ballet, the institution's budget grew by 500%, and it enjoyed unprecedented advances in the scope and quality of its work on stage, in the size and reach of its professional school, and in the development of several farreaching community engagement programs, which he founded. Webre launched an array of artistic initiatives including *The American Experience*, which developed great works of literature into full-length ballets, including *The Great Gatsby* and Hemingway's *The Sun Also Rises*, among others.

As a choreographer, Webre's works appear in the repertoires of ballet companies throughout North America, including Pacific Northwest Ballet, Les Grands Ballets Canadiens, Colorado Ballet, Ballet West, Atlanta Ballet, Cincinnati Ballet, Ballet Austin, Ballet Memphis, Milwaukee Ballet, Kansas City Ballet, Ballet Concierto de Puerto Rico, and many others, and he has worked frequently in theatre as well as opera. As a dancer, Webre was featured in solo and principal roles from the classical repertoire as well as in contemporary works by choreographers such as Twyla Tharp, Paul Taylor, and Merce Cunningham. He has served on the juries of a number of international ballet competitions, including those in Varna, Bulgaria, Istanbul, Cape Town, New York, Seoul, and elsewhere. He has served on the board of Dance/USA and his work has received numerous honors, grants, and awards. He holds a degree in History/Pre-Law from the University of Texas at Austin, and is the seventh son in a large, boisterous, Cuban-American family.




MAYU ODAKA




