ARTISTIC DIRECTOR'S BIOGRAPHY



ROBERT MILLS

Since being named Artistic Director of Oklahoma City Ballet in 2008, Robert Mills has established himself as a prominent member of the Oklahoma arts scene and in the process has brought the company national recognition as one of the fastest growing ballet companies in the United States.

Born in Gary, Indiana and raised just outside of Chicago, Robert had access to world class ballet training at an early age. In Indiana he trained with Natalie Mayoch-Kolosci before moving on to study with some of Kolosci's mentors in Chicago including Richard Ellis, Christine DuBoulay, Larry Long, and Anna Paskevska. He completed his training at the School of the

Philadelphia Ballet, and at the Joffrey Ballet School in New York City. He then enjoyed a 14-year professional performing career dancing with numerous companies across the United States including Oklahoma City Ballet, Kansas City Ballet, Milwaukee Ballet, Philadelphia Ballet, among others.

Throughout Mills' tenure with Oklahoma City Ballet, patrons have enjoyed seeing the extraordinary advancements made in the scope and quality of the company's work on stage. Keeping a focus on education and community engagement, the organization can boast dramatically increased enrollment in its Yvonne Chouteau School under Mills' guidance plus the addition of numerous community engagement programs geared towards broadening OKC Ballet's reach in the community.

A prolific choreographer, Robert has created 12 new works during his time at Oklahoma City Ballet. His work has been seen across the United States, and in 2017 he was selected to take part in the National Choreographers Initiative in Southern California, an honor bestowed to only four American choreographers per year.

Reporting on Robert's time with OKC Ballet, *The Oklahoman* newspaper wrote; "During Mills' ten years of artistic leadership of OKC Ballet, dance lovers in Oklahoma have had the pleasure of seeing an all-but-failed ballet company grow into a vibrant, passionate, powerful group of performers." In 2018, Robert was presented with a Governor's Arts Award from the state of Oklahoma for community service.

Prior to joining Oklahoma City Ballet as Artistic Director, Robert spent three years as Artistic Director of Ballet Nouveau Colorado in Denver. Of his time in Colorado, *The Denver Post* wrote, "Mills was instrumental in putting it on the map...Mills is now an artistic director responsible for one of Colorado's biggest dance success stories." Ballet Nouveau Colorado has since divided into two organizations. The performing company is now known as Wonderbound and the school became Colorado Conservatory of Dance.



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


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ARTIST BIOGRAPHIES

SUSANNE HUBBS Costume Designer

Susanne Hubbs, The Costume Lady, has been designing and sewing costumes for dancers, figure skaters, and synchronized swimmers for 40 years. Her costumes have been worn by hundreds of Youth America Grand Prix competitors, as well as many elite international figure skaters. Tutus designed and created by Hubbs have been featured in *Pointe Magazine*. Other ballet designs have been created for and worn by Oklahoma City Ballet, Brandywine Ballet, St. Lucie Ballet, Imagine Ballet Theatre, and Ballet Nouveau Colorado. She has collaborated for many years with the choreographers and dancers of Ormao, creating hundreds of innovative contemporary dance costumes.

Hubbs started ballet training at the age of five, continuing on to perform with the Olympia Festival Ballet, the American Jazz Dance Company, Dayton Ballet and Dayton Ballet II, Alaska Dance Theatre, and Ballet Alaska. She received the "Young Choreographers" award from Regional Dance America. She taught ballet for 37 years, with students going on to prestigious college dance programs and professional careers in dance.

Today, her design studio is a bustling creative space, located in beautiful Colorado Springs, Colorado.

AARON MOONEY Lighting Designer

Aaron Mooney is the Resident Lighting Designer and Professor of Lighting Design at Oklahoma City University, where he joined the faculty in 2012. He holds an MFA in Theatre Design from New York University's Tisch School of the Arts and a BA in Theatre Education from The University of Tulsa. Mooney has lit events in spaces as large as Radio City Music Hall (NYC), the Western Heritage Museum (OKC), and The Joint at the Hard Rock Casino (Tulsa), as well as spaces so small that they barely deserve to be called theatres.

Recent design credits include The Little Mermaid, The Firebird, Swan Lake, Giselle, La Slyphide, Our Private Rooms, A Midsummer Night's Dream, Romeo & Juliet, The Nutcracker, Exurgency (Oklahoma City Ballet); An American in Paris (Music Theatre Wichita); Noises Off, Death of a Salesman (Montana Shakespeare in the Parks); Pageant (Lyric OK); and King Lear (Oklahoma Shakespeare in the Park). Previous Lighting Designs for OCU include Spamalot, The Music Man, Crazy for You, Susannah, Side Show, The Marriage of Figaro, Sister Act, Three Sisters, Hairspray, Mr. Burns: A Post-Electric Play, As You Like It, RENT, Brigadoon, The Grapes of Wrath, South Pacific, Street Scene, 9 to 5: The Musical, Bernstein's MASS, and The Dialogues of the Carmelites.

In addition to all of his theatrical design work, Mooney has worked on exhibition lighting at the S.R. Guggenheim Museum, the National Academy of Design, the Cooper Hewitt National Design Museum, the National Museum of the Native American (NYC), and the Morgan Museum & Library. Fashion lighting in New York City includes Barneys New York, Prada, Armani, and Dolce + Gabbana. Mooney lives in OKC with his wife, Lisa, and his son, Eli.

ARTIST BIOGRAPHIES



JAYCE OGREN Conductor

Jayce Ogren has established himself as one of the most innovative and versatile conductors of his generation. From symphonic concerts to revolutionary community service programs to operatic world premieres, Mr. Ogren is a leader in breaking down barriers between audiences and great music.

Mr. Ogren began his career as Assistant Conductor of The Cleveland Orchestra and Music Director of the Cleveland Youth Orchestra, a concurrent appointment he held from 2006-2009. In the years since, he has conducted many of the world's most prominent orchestras, including the BBC Symphony, Boston Symphony, Ensemble Intercontemporain,

Hong Kong Philharmonic, Los Angeles Philharmonic, New York Philharmonic, the Dallas and San Francisco Symphonies, and the Saint Paul Chamber Orchestra, in programs ranging from Mozart to Beethoven through Sibelius and Bernstein, to presenting U.S. and world premieres of works by Steve Mackey and Nico Muhly.

Among the numerous progressive projects Mr. Ogren has conducted are the New York premieres of Leonard Bernstein's only opera, A Quiet Place, and puppeteer Basil Twist's The Rite of Spring, both at Lincoln Center; the world premiere of David Lang's symphony for a broken orchestra, bringing together 400 students, amateur and professional musicians in Philadelphia; and the world premiere of Jack Perla's Shalimar the Clown at Opera Theatre of St. Louis.

A longtime collaborator of singer/songwriter/composer Rufus Wainwright, Mr. Ogren conducted the 2012 U.S. premiere of his opera *Prima Donna* at the Brooklyn Academy of Music, and led its recording with the BBC Symphony on Deutsche Grammaphon in 2016. Mr. Ogren and Mr. Wainwright have since appeared together throughout the world, with ensembles such as the National Arts Centre Orchestra in Ottawa, the Orchestre national d'Île-de-France in Paris and the Toronto Symphony.

A devoted educator, Mr. Ogren was invited by renowned poet Paul Muldoon to create an interdisciplinary studio class at Princeton University for the 2017-2018 academic year. He has worked with students at the Brevard Music Center, the Juilliard School, Manhattan School of Music, Music Academy of the West, and Verbier Festival. In 2016, he presented a unique workshop in orchestral rehearsal techniques for music teachers at Carnegie Hall in collaboration with the Carnegie Hall Weill Music Institute and the Juilliard School Pre-College. For his own part, Mr. Ogren earned his Masters in conducting at the New England Conservatory and studied as a Fulbright Scholar with Jorma Panula.

A native of Hoquiam, Washington, Jayce Ogren lives in Brooklyn, New York with his wife Carly, an architect, and their son, Alistair. An avid athlete, he has run the Big Sur, Boston, and New York City Marathons, the JFK 50 Miler trail run, and the Ironman Lake Placid triathlon. As an individual member of 1% for the Planet, Mr. Ogren is proud to connect his artistic work with his deep love of nature and concern for the environment.




